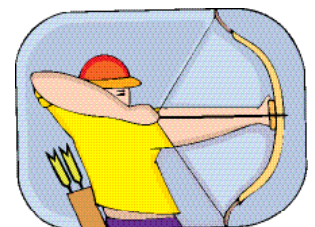
**Bowmen Donations:** The club officers voted to donate \$300 to NAIS and \$100 each to the MBS, and HFHF organizations.
